Charity – a "payer" source ?

- Every Hospital needs a Charity Strategy
- Think of it as just another "payer group"

Caring for a defined population...

Expecting a return on investment

ROI: Improved Health, Reduced Costs

Before (2009)

• \$116 charity costs

Over 50% ER visits – non-emergent

Patients "living" in the hospital

Before (2009)

 ER: a place of respite for social service agencies / law enforcement

Safety Net providers at capacity

Spartanburg Regional Spartanburg County

Reduced Charity costs \$116 million -2009 \$68 million -2016

Improved County Health ranking 19th – 2011 14th - 2017

Return on Investment

 Understand what's driving admissions, visits

 Focus Upstream: Prevention / Early Intervention

Build Partnerships to Create Solutions

- Founded 1992:
 - community and faith leaders
- Services:
 - 44 hours of patient care weekly using volunteerstaff model.
 - In house pharmacy 30 hours
 - Provides regular medical home
- Patients: low-income, uninsured
- 2016 Clinic Operating Expenses \$938,287

• Hospital Partnerships:

- Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System
- Mary Black Hospital
- Services: free of charge for approved St. Luke's patients

Relationship in place since organization's inception

- 2016 Value of Direct Services on site (medical, ancillary, prescriptions, transportation) \$8,571,868
- 2016 Value of Investment for Direct Services provided: \$8.14
- 2016 Value of Indirect Services (hospitals)
 \$4,633,974
- Value of Investment for total services provided \$13.00

- Provided 7717 medical visits for 2300 individuals in 2016 – avg. ER visit cost \$1200. Savings for hospital of \$2,760,000 if each individual went to ER only once last year.
- Bottom line: every connection to a primary medical home and a specialty visit saves ER and Critical Care Hospital dollars
